Results collection and Transition meetings

RE: GCSE Results Day 20th August 2020 – Important Information

As I explained in my last message to you, **the school will be open to students on 20th August - GCSE results day, for you to collect your results and have a personalised meeting with a member of staff to support your transition.**

To ensure the results day can operate as safely as possible we have had to limit students to a strict time slot of 30 mins in the school building. Please see below your specific time slot to collect results and meet a member of staff. To support the safe running of the day please ensure you arrive promptly at your allocated time slot. **Students arriving late will have to be re-allocated a time for the following day.**

IMPORTANT: Your individualised time slot and meeting time

On the day you must **arrive through the main school reception entrance via the bottom gate** to collect your GCSE results

You will then have up to 10 minutes in the concourse where you can look over your results.

Your **transition meeting** details have been sent to you regarding your specific meeting time slot, location of the meeting and the member of staff you will be meeting with.

At the meeting you will be able to either discuss your enrolment into Sixth Form and confirm your subjects or you will be able to discuss your other careers options.

Due to government guidance **parents will not be able to attend the results collection and meetings**, it is therefore important that you discuss options with your parents/carers ahead of the results day. If you require a longer meeting to discuss your results or transition you will be asked to book a time slot for the following day (Friday 21st August).

If for any reason your situation has changed and you do not wish to come into school at this time or may not be able to, we ask that you contact us via email at Lisa.Jones@thecompton.org.uk and we will make arrangements to send your results out to you.

Important Information

Centre Assessed Grades and Sixth Form Enrolment

Many of you have asked about how the enrolment to The Compton Sixth Form will relate to the process of awarding centre assessed grades. I am delighted to inform you that we will be basing our decisions on the centre assessed grades, **provided by us as a school**, to determine whether students have met the entry criteria and subject specific requirements for the courses you wish to study.

This means, as internal applicants, you will have the advantage that we know what you are capable of and we will do our utmost to support you gaining entry to the courses you wish to study.

Appeals and Autumn Exams

Clearly, the absence of any public exams this year means that the scope and process for appeals is also very different. Fundamentally, because there are no exam papers to review, it is **not possible** to appeal the final grade awarded to your child.

The only grounds for any appeal therefore, is as follows:

- That you believe the school or exam board has made a clerical error
- Students have concerns about bias, discrimination or any other factor that suggests that the school did not behave with care or integrity when determining grades

If you are unhappy with the awarded grade, you do have the right to sit an exam in this Autumn between Monday 2nd November and finish on Monday 23rd November, (Full GCSE Exam Timetable to be shared when available), but the preparation for this exam will not be provided by the school as, we will not have the resources to provide teachers for catch-up classes. The examination re-sit will not take into account any NEA (coursework/practical) components of the qualification.

For students enrolling into Sixth Form

The following details outline all the essential information you will need to enrol into The Compton Sixth Form and for the start of the new term.

Key Enrolment Dates

- Thursday 20th August - GCSE Results day and Enrolment day 1
(Internal students 9am-12.30pm, External students 1.30pm-3.30pm)
- Friday 21st August - Enrolment day 2- 12pm-3pm (All students)

On 20th August the school will be open from 9am for internal students and from 1.30pm for external students. All students on the day will be given specific time slots to arrive at school.

Upon receiving your results, you will meet with senior staff and discuss your GCSE results. If you **meet the required entry criteria** and **there is space available on your chosen courses**, we will finalise your course choices and enrol you into the Sixth Form.

Key Start of Term Dates

- Thurs 3rd September - Students attend administration day 12.30pm- 2.30pm school hall
(Surnames A-M 12.30pm – 1.30pm and Surnames N-Z 1.30pm – 2.30pm)
- Student school photos will be taken on this day therefore students must attend in smart Sixth Form dress.
- Fri 4th September - First day of term- Introduction to the Year in school
- Mon 7th and Tue 8th Sept - Induction to the Year for KS3/4 students - Year 12 not required in school
- Weds 9th September - Lessons begin- normal school day 8.35am

Following the enrolment process, all students must be available for the start of term on all of the dates above.
